Use the following procedure to perform adjustment:<br><b>1 When adjusting the print position on the front side, load 11 sheets of paper in the tray. Load 31 sheets when adjusting for both sides.</b><br><b>2 Press [Adjustment] for "Front Side Registration" or "Front &amp; Back Registration".</b><br>Adjustment is performed by printing <u>five sheets</u> for adjusting the front side or <u>10 sheets</u> for adjusting the front and back sides, and one sheet for confirming the adjustment result.<br><b>3 Check the adjustment result, and press [Apply].</b><br>The setting value that reflects the adjustment result is applied. | <b>Auto Adjust Image Position</b><br>Perform automatic adjustment of the print position on the front side or both sides of white custom paper allocated to the tray. - Paper is ejected with the print side facing up when printing on banner paper in the printer function with the banner sheet tray of multi bypass tray (Tray A) or banner sheet tray of two-tray wide LCT attached. The setting specified by clearing the [Eject Face-up] check box or the output orientation specified in the color controller is ignored.
